- F. To institute a system of transitional justice in order to address and remedy the injustices inflicted upon innocent parties throughout the conflict.

Acting President Calls for United Military Alliance in Spring Revolution

Acting President Duwa Lashi La stated that all ethnic groups should unite to form a broad military alliance amid the Spring Revolution. He made the remarks on February 12 during a ceremony marking the 78th anniversary of the signing of the Panglong Agreement.

“We aim to establish a revolutionary pact between the central region and the ethnic states, similar to the Panglong Agreement. Additionally, we all hope for the emergence of a united military alliance comprising all ethnic groups,” he said.

He emphasized that the essence of the Spring Revolution is liberation from fear and described it as the largest and most intense people’s revolution in modern history. He also urged revolution forces to remain focused, stating that the common enemy is the military junta.

NUG Health Ministry Provides Extensive Healthcare Amidst Conflict

The National Unity Government (NUG) and the Ministry of Health have provided healthcare services across 190 townships in Myanmar. This includes 106 hospitals, over 800 clinics, and around 200 mobile clinics, as announced by spokesperson U Kyaw Zaw in a public address. "Under the Ministry of Health, healthcare services have been delivered in 190 townships with 106 hospitals, more than 800 clinics, and around 200 mobile clinics. These efforts have enabled us to treat over 900,000 outpatients, 37,000 inpatients, more than 23,000 surgical patients, over 3,200 trauma cases, and around 4,300 patients requiring

transfer," U Kyaw Zaw said. Additionally, due to the ongoing conflict and landmine threats, the NUG Health Ministry, in coordination with state and regional health teams, has assisted around 700 people from the People's Defence Force, ethnic armed organizations, revolutionary allies, and civilians who suffered physical injuries. These efforts included fitting prosthetics, rehabilitation exercises, and other necessary treatments.

Pro-Democracy Groups Issue Joint Statement on Myanmar's Political Future



Joint Declaration

3 February 2025

1. With the common goal of strengthening military democracy and establishing a federal democratic system that is representative to all, we are united in our commitment to the principles of equality and the will of the people, we are embarking on our revolutionary journey through a historic and liberating process that focuses on strengthening grassroots unity, guided by the belief that the strength of the nation lies in the strength of its individuals and units, from the outset of the revolution through the transitional period to the establishment of a future federal democratic system.

2. At the dawn of 2025, we remain steadfast in our collective struggle to achieve the shared goal of strength as ardently desired by the people. We are forging broader, stronger, and more diverse alliances to advance together towards our shared goal.

3. We honor the contributions of our people and the political and revolutionary forces to the Civil Disobedience Movement, Operation 1027, and other significant achievements across various fronts of the revolution. We also recognize the continued representation of Ambassador U Hkun Mya Tun at the United Nations, a diplomatic victory that stands as a testament to people's resilience.

4. We consider the release of political leaders, including Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, and political prisoners who have been arrested and detained to be of utmost importance for resolving Myanmar's current issues.

5. We have set forth the following six political objectives to guide the establishment of a federal democratic system:

(a) To overturn the usurpation of state power by the military, and to terminate the functioning of the armed forces apparatus.

(b) To ensure that all armed forces operate solely under the command of a civilian government.

(c) To strengthen the constitution of 2008 in its entirety, and to launch all attempts to restore its provisions.

(d) To engage in a constructive dialogue with the military and democratic forces, gathering the consensus of all relevant parties.

(e) To establish a new constitution that establishes federalism and democratic values, gathering the consensus of all relevant parties.

(f) To establish federal democratic institutions in accordance with the proposed federal democratic constitution.

(g) To institute a system of transitional justice to address justice and accountability for various of questions, including gender-based violence, during the conflict period.

6. We shall address the matters of defining and establishing state and federal units and delineating boundaries during the transitional period based on the will of the people, without

any discrimination, and through peaceful negotiations in political dialogue that include all primary stakeholders. Any disputes that arise among revolutionary forces will be regarded as internal disagreements and will be resolved amicably through peaceful means.

7. The services advisory junta is the primary perpetrator driving Myanmar towards disintegration. The Aung Mye Thaw and his associates must be held accountable for their crimes against Myanmar. We urge members of the armed forces to disassociate themselves from the services advisory junta and join the people in establishing a credible, professional institution encompassed and supported by the people.

8. The services advisory junta holds no authority to hold elections, nor is the current political situation in the country conducive to holding elections. The junta's preparation to conduct a sham election will not only lead Myanmar towards further disintegration and unstable conditions but will also contribute to increased regional instability. We urge the people and the international community to refrain from engaging, supporting, or recognizing the junta.

9. The services advisory junta's ongoing crimes, including forced conscription, are severely damaging the socio-economic livelihood of Myanmar, causing internal and external displacement of the people and endangering regional stability. We call on the international community to work with us, the revolutionary forces, to provide practical and effective support to urgently address the suffering inflicted by the people of Myanmar. We urge certain nations to cease the provision and sale of military supplies, including weapons fuel, and to refrain from diplomatic recognition and engagement, that emboldens the junta to continue its acts of violence against the people.

10. With unwavering determination, we ardently pledge to continue our revolutionary endeavor to realize the emergence of a federal democratic system that fulfills the aspirations of all our people.

declaration emphasizes the importance of securing the release of political leaders and prisoners, including Aung San Suu Kyi, as a crucial step toward resolving Myanmar's current crisis. It also urges all revolutionary forces to resolve internal disputes peacefully, treating them as allied conflicts rather than adversarial confrontations.

The IRF Summit was attended by over 1,500 representatives from more than 41 countries, bringing together global leaders and advocates to discuss strategies for promoting religious freedom and countering repression.

NUG Urges Forced Conscripts to Defect to Revolution Forces

The National Unity Government's (NUG) Ministry of Defence has called on young people forcibly conscripted by the military council to defect to the nearest revolution forces as soon as possible. The statement encouraged conscripts to reach out to People's Defense Forces (PDFs), local defence groups, or ethnic revolutionary organizations at any stage—whether during military training or after being armed and deployed. It provided contact information for PDF battalions, defense networks, and the Telegram channel @MyanmarPeople for coordination.

The NUG assured that those who defect will receive the highest level of safety and protection. It also stated that individuals who surrender with weapons and ammunition will be rewarded appropriately. The statement further condemned the junta's aggressive use of forced conscription to address its manpower shortages.

Myanmar Beer Shipment Linked to Military Seized and Destroyed in Shwebo



People’s Defence Forces (PDF) in Khin-U Township, Shwebo District, Sagaing Region, seized a shipment of Myanmar Beer on February 11 under the guidance of the township’s People’s Administration. The beer was allegedly owned by the military junta, their families, or affiliated business partners.

The confiscated items, valued at approximately 100 million kyats (approx. USD 22,000), included:

- 71 crates (852 bottles) of Myanmar Beer (bottled)
- 24 crates (576 cans) of Myanmar Beer (canned)

The seized goods were publicly destroyed with official documentation.

The PDF urged the public to continue boycotting military council-owned products, as profits from these businesses allegedly contribute to violence against civilians and revolution forces.

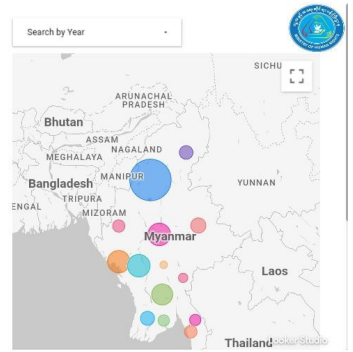

The National Unity Government’s (NUG) Ministry of Human Rights has reported more than 16,000 cases of human rights violations committed by the terrorist military council. As of now, a total of 16,178 incidents have been recorded, based on complaints submitted to the ministry and systematically collected data. To facilitate real-time monitoring and reference, the ministry has

Editor's Notes

The National Unity Government (NUG) continues to express its commitment to fostering a united future for all ethnic groups, with hopes of forming a major alliance among revolution forces, much like the 2021 Panlong Agreement, aiming to secure peace between the regions of the country. The Acting President has emphasized the desire to establish a revolutionary framework that bridges ethnic divisions and promotes unity for the country's future.

As part of its efforts to strengthen ethnic solidarity, the NUG has sent messages for ethnic celebrations such as the 78th Shan National Day and the 77th Karen National Day, and has also extended correspondence for the Kachin Revolution Day. The Ministry of Defence continues to coordinate with various political and civil organizations, including the Chin Brotherhood, the Federal Parliament Representation Committee, the National Democratic Force, and the Ethnic Consultative Council. These groups are working together to advance the six political objectives set forth, including the release of political leaders such as Daw Aung San Suu Kyi and other political prisoners, in hopes of resolving the nation's ongoing challenges.

In the wake of human rights violations committed by the military junta, which has been responsible for over 16,178 incidents, the Ministry of Human Rights has compiled comprehensive data and released a dashboard for public access. This initiative aims to systematically track and report the ongoing human rights abuses, with the goal of making this crucial information available for international advocacy and legal purposes.

Junta Forces Burn 20 Homes in Ohnmathee Village, Killed Civilians in Airstrike



On January 26, 2025, the terrorist military council's forces set fire to approximately 20 homes in Ohnmathee Village, located in the Nawngkhio Township of Ta'ang region, at 5:30 PM, according to a statement released by the Ta'ang National Liberation Army (TNLA) on January 27. This was the third such attack on the village, with similar incidents occurring on December 29, 2024, and January 19, 2025. In total, the military junta has targeted the local civilian homes three times with arson.

Additionally, on January 22, 2025, junta forces launched an airstrike using jet fighters against

the Nawngkhio police station and the nearby Parami tea shop, killing eight civilians and injuring one. The TNLA warned that the junta forces are deliberately targeting civilians with bombings, urging the local population to remain vigilant and avoid such attacks. They also recommended implementing measures for air defense to protect against further aerial assaults.

Military Operations Summary for First Week of February, 2025

A military council convoy transporting supplies from the No. 21 Weapon Factory (KaPaSa) was ambushed on the Seikphyu-Kan Zun road by joint revolution forces, including Minbu District Battalion 1, Pakokku District Battalion 19, the Magway People's Defence Force, and CGF troops. The attack resulted in the destruction of two military council vehicles and the deaths of 11 junta soldiers. Despite the military's defensive preparations near the KaPaSa factory, the Arakan Army has advanced into Pantanaw Township, Bago

Region. In Tamu Township, on the India-Myanmar border, revolution forces launched assaults on military council bases near Pan Tha and Kyun Pin Tha villages, where junta troops have heavily fortified positions. Meanwhile, the Kachin Independence Army (KIA) and allied forces have intensified their offensive against Bhamo, Kachin State's second-largest city. The Arakan Army has also launched an offensive on Sittwe, the capital of Rakhine State. Revolution forces are using howitzers and heavy artillery to target mil-

itary council positions from multiple directions. Following their capture of the Western Regional Military Command in Ann, the Arakan Army has expanded its offensive deeper into Magway, Bago, and Ayeyarwady regions.

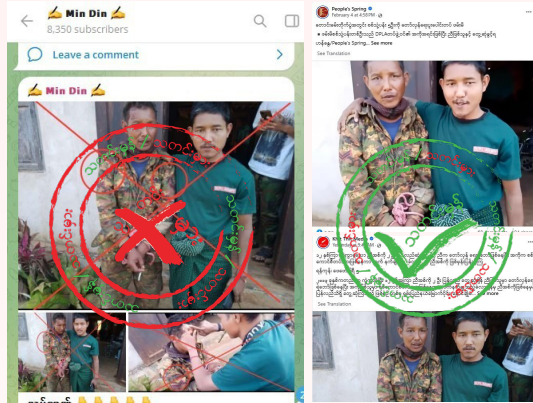

A pro-military Telegram channel, Min Din, falsely claimed that a widely circulated story about two long-separated brothers one a junta soldier now under PDF arrest and the other a revolution fighter was untrue. The channel alleged that the event never happened and was fabricated as propaganda.



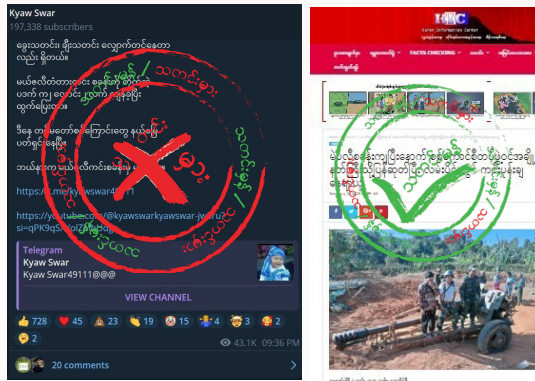
Authentic News

Independent and credible news agencies confirmed that the reunion took place at the Danu People's Liberation Army (DPLA) base in Naungcho Township, northern Shan State. The two brothers had been separated since 2003. When they met after 12 years, the older brother, a junta soldier, had just surrendered his weapon, only to realize that the person in front of him was his long-lost younger brother. A military-affiliated Telegram channel, Kyaw Swa, falsely reported that no revolution groups were able to capture the Mepale camp in Belin Township, Mon State, and denied any significant developments in the area.



Independent and trusted news outlets confirmed that revolution forces successfully captured the Mepale camp from the military council. During the operation, junta troops abandoned the camp, leaving behind weapons and military equipment, which were subsequently seized.

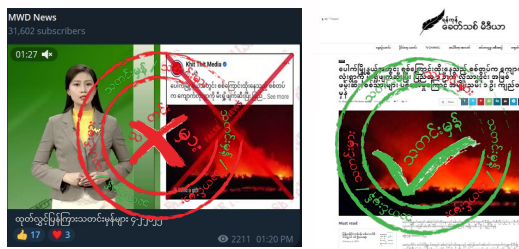

The MWD News Telegram channel, associated with the military council, falsely reported that no military action had taken place by the junta in the villages of Pauk Township, Magway Region, and denied any destruction by junta forces in the area.



Independent and reliable news sources reported that the military junta had indeed attacked villages in Pauk Township, Magway Region. The military council forces set fire to civilian homes and destroyed properties, while also detaining local residents during the raids.
